



STEM

- STEM class is project-based learning, tying into science content

- Projects will be based upon science lessons
- Bring content to STEM to apply it to a project
- Collaborative projects have timelines, division of duties, rubrics to follow to guide the work
- Therefore, class expectations in STEM will vary from other classes

- Provides support to middle school classes

- Recording work time for video projects
- Website design and work time (6th grade marketplace)
- HSPT practice testing (8th grade)
- Second quarter will begin keyboarding lessons
 - All students 6th-8th grade need their own keyboards
- Provides IT support to THE ENTIRE SCHOOL with the iPad program and other technical needs

SCIENCE CLASS EXPECTATIONS

- Respect everyone

- Olweus Bullying Prevention Program, lessons weekly across the full campus

- Student responsibility

- Read websites daily and complete your work on time, whether present or absent
- Communicate with me over email as needed, especially when absent/missing work is involved
- Review and practice material nightly

- Grades

- Use the FACTS/RenWeb system with your child so they can see their progress
- Their ability to monitor should translate into taking action when assignments are missing or absent, talking to me when assistance is needed with the material, etc.

SCIENCE CLASS EXPECTATIONS

- Policies

- School day goes from 7:45-3:05 (M-Th) and 7:45-12:45 (F); be on time
- All assignments are due at 7:00 a.m.
- All assignments are found in Schoology and turned into Schoology (no Showbie)
- Absent work must be completed in a timely manner (2 days per day of absence) AND send an email to the teacher when each assignment is completed
- Make up tests are before school at 7 a.m.
- Missing/late work will not be accepted after 1 week past due
- Absent and missing assignments must be completed before the chapter test

Grades

- Classwork = 20%
 Homework = 10%
 Quizzes = 30%
 Tests = 40%
 *Midterm/Final = 10%

- = 35% in 2nd & 4th quarters

*midterms/finals are for 7th and 8th grades; 6th grade, just focus on the white box

Frequent Uniform Issues Addressed
